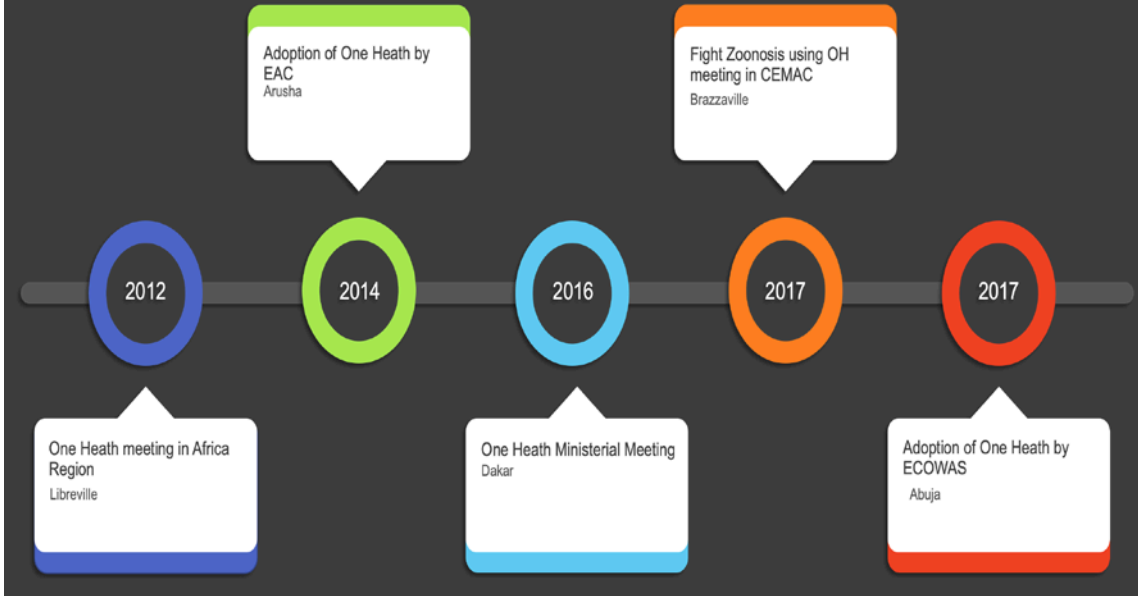

Country level

- One Health Policy (Rwanda)
- One Health Strategic plan (Several countries)
- National domestic resource allocated annually (Cameroon)
- One Health platform governance manual (Several countries)
- One Health Advocacy and communication plan (Cameroon)
- Zoonotic diseases preparedness and Response plans (Several countries)
- AMR NAP (Several countries)

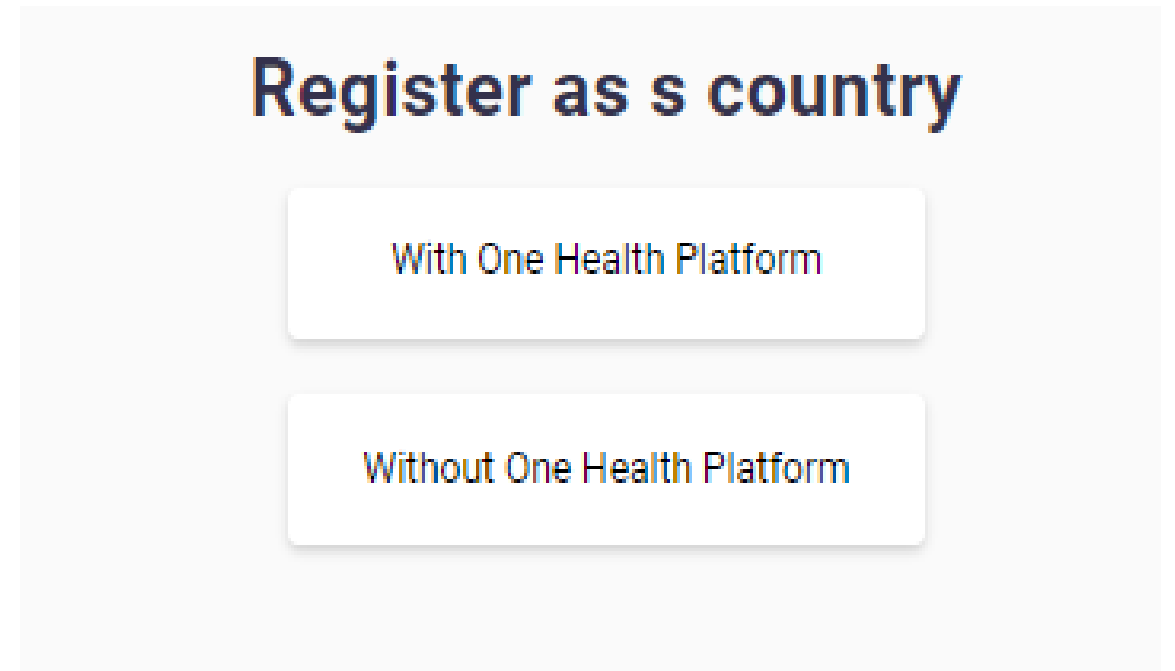
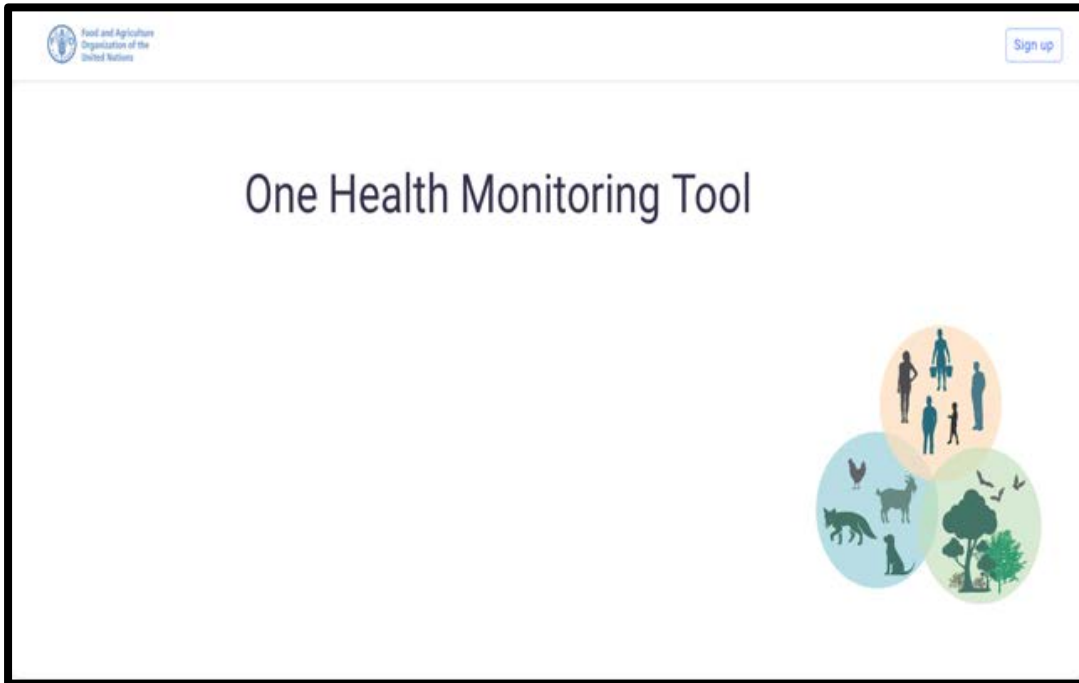
- There is significant progress at the country and regional level to institutionalize and operationalize OH

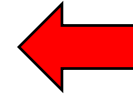

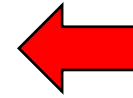

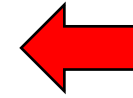
Structure of the tool



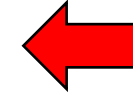

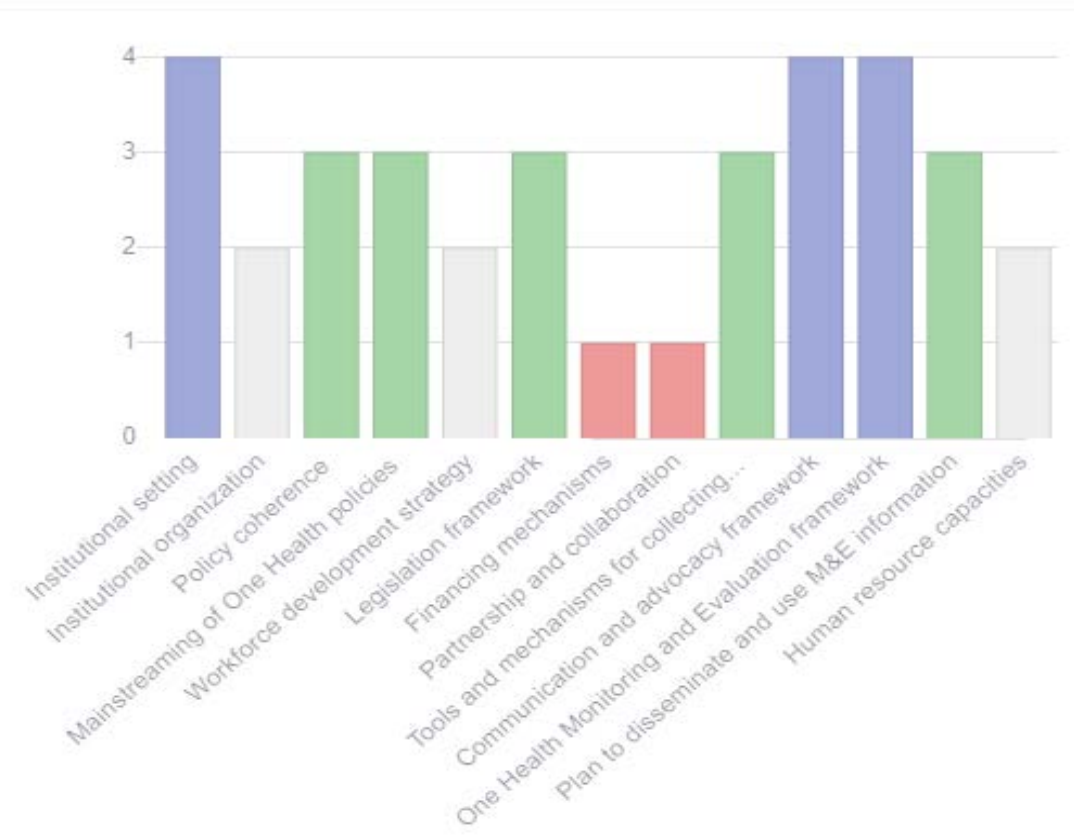

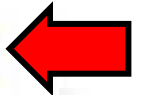

Spider- wed diagram (Results)

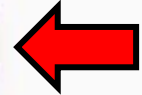
